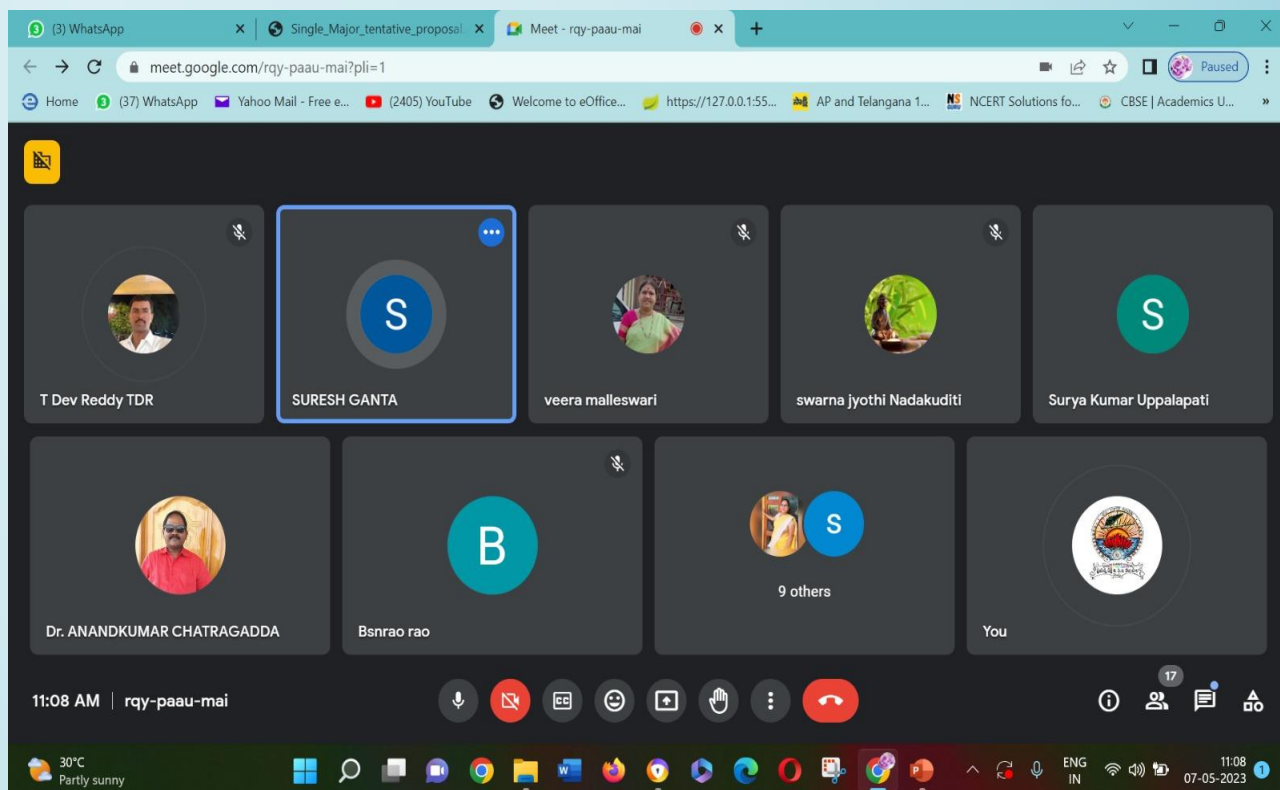
STAFF MEETING ON 01.05.2023

The staff members of VSR GDC Movva met today virtually through Google meet at 11:30 a.m. under the chairmanship of the College Principal, Dr S Madhavi, and discussed the following:

- It has been resolved that the lecturers will conduct online classes for their respective courses and cover at least one unit of the syllabus as per the guidelines provided by Krishna University. The lecturers must share the links of their online classes with the TLP coordinator and ensure a minimum of 75% attendance by the students. The Academic Coordinator is requested to provide the schedule for the online class work.
 - The coordinators of the Unnati training program, in conjunction with the internship coordinators for BA and BCom courses, are instructed to provide a list of students, batch-wise, who will attend the program scheduled tentatively for May 10th or 20th. They are also required to submit the schedule of lecturers who will monitor the offline internship program for third-year students, as well as for the Unnati training program during the holidays.
 - The progress of e-content generation was discussed, and lecturers who have been assigned topics are directed to complete the four quadrants of e-content generation and submit the necessary details to the LMS coordinator.
 - The JKC coordinator, along with the JKC mentor, is instructed to gather information about local companies or organizations, communicate with their HR repress, record their requirements, train students accordingly, and plan for a job drive by the end of June.
 - Sri M Anil Kumar, Lecturer in Botany, has been assigned the responsibility of planning and executing the college-level best practices for this academic year and establishing a botanical garden on the campus. Meanwhile, Captain R. Venkaiah, Lecturer in History, has been instructed to submit data related to the Adult Literacy Program as soon as possible, with proper records and evidence.
 - It has been resolved to hold an online meeting with the IQAC team and Criterion In-charges to discuss the draft copy of the SSR and address the gaps identified during the Principal's review.

- Dr. N Krishna Mohan, the Admissions Coordinator and Lecturer in Physics, is instructed to proceed with the admission process following the announcement of intermediate results.

UG Programme with a combination of Mathematics, Physics and Computer Science (MPCs) with a sanction intake of 50 Students will be converted to Single Major B.Sc. Honours (Physics) and B.Sc. Honours (Computer Science) with an opted intake of 25 students each.
 2. Resolved to convert the existing B.Sc. UG Programme with a combination of Mathematics, Physics and Chemistry (MPC) with a sanction intake of 30 Students will be converted to Single Major B.Sc. Honours (Chemistry) with an opted intake of 30 students.
 3. Resolved to convert the existing B.Sc. UG Programme with a combination of Mathematics,

Electronics and Computer Science ((MECs) with a sanction intake of 30 Students will be converted to Single Major B.Sc. Honours (Electronics) with an opted intake of 30 students.

4. Resolved to convert the existing B.Sc. UG Programme with a combination of Mathematics, Physics and Web Enabled Technologies (MPWet) with a sanction intake of 30 Students will be converted to Single Major B.Sc. Honours (Web Enabled Technologies) with an opted intake of 30 students
5. Resolved to convert the existing B.Sc. UG Programme with a combination of Mathematics, Electronics and Internet of Things (MEIoT) with a sanction intake of 30 Students will be converted to Single Major B.Sc. Honours (Mathematics) with an opted intake of 30 students.

Resolved to convert the existing B.A. UG Programme with a combination of History, Economics and Political Science (HEP) with a sanction intake of 40 Students will be converted to Single Major B.A. Honours (History), B.A. Honours (Economics) and B.A. Honours (Political Science) with an opted intake of 14,13 and 13 students respectively.

STAFF MEETING ON 10.05.2023

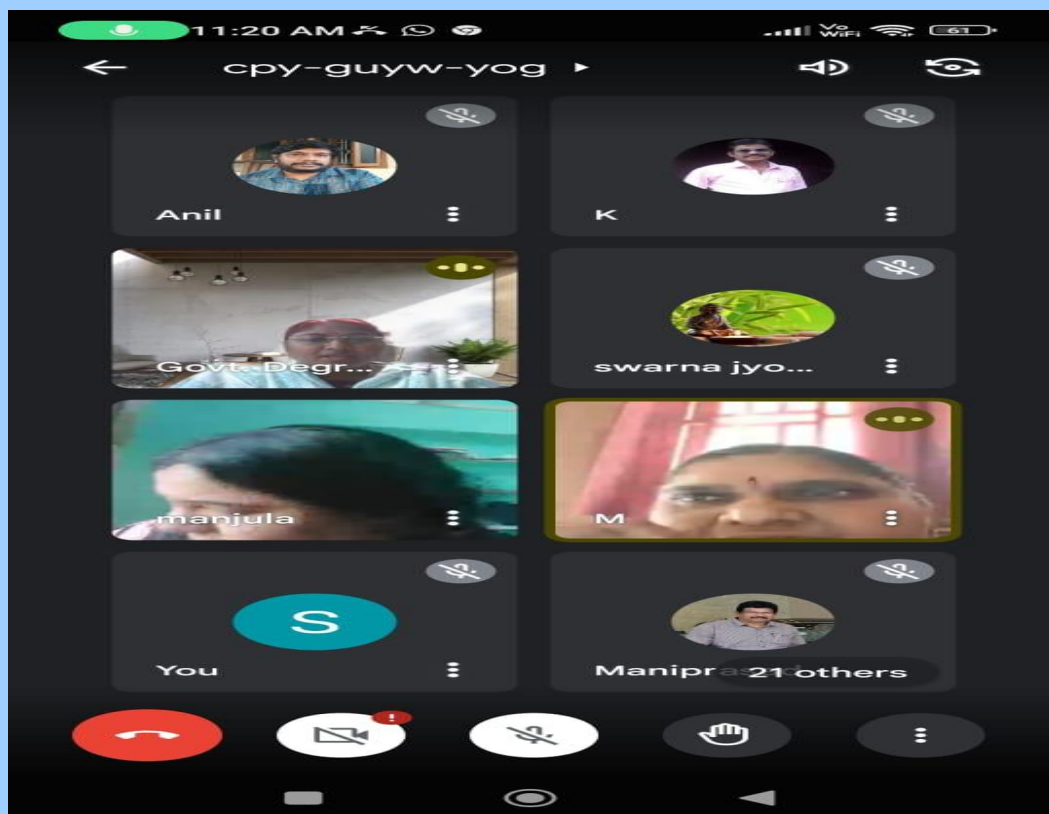

- The lecturers are taking online classes according to the schedule and completing one unit of the syllabus, as instructed by the Krishna University. However, due to the NCC camp and other technical glitches, there has been low attendance of students.
 - Resolved to submit the data related to the monthly report of the college by the first week of every month. The concerned Incharges should submit the information in the Google spreadsheet designed by the college.
 - Resolved to conduct a Second Phase Admissions campaign after the completion of Intermediate Supplementary examinations. Staff members are instructed to collect phone numbers of the students and talk with them personally and take utmost care to enhance the admissions this year. It was also resolved to share the College Admissions Brochure through social platforms. The Action Plan for the Admissions campaign is to be prepared by Sri U. Surya Kumar, Lecturer in Mathematics, and the same is to be submitted to the Principal after the re-opening of the college.

THREE DAY RESIDENTIAL TRAINING PROGRAMME ON STRENGTHENING ASSESSMENT AND ACCREDITATION

APCCE has been monitoring, guiding and handholding the Government and Private Aided Degree Colleges in the State for Assessment and Accreditation by NAAC. As per the direction by Hon'ble Chief Minister of Andhra Pradesh to complete Assessment and Accreditation of the Colleges within three years, the Commissionerate has established a Special Cell for monitoring the NAAC Process.

To strengthen this process further through decentralization for a sustainable development mechanism, a three day residential training is proposed to be conducted from 16-05-2023 to 18-05-2023 for select IQAC Coordinators and potential teachers to assist in the processes of assessment.
