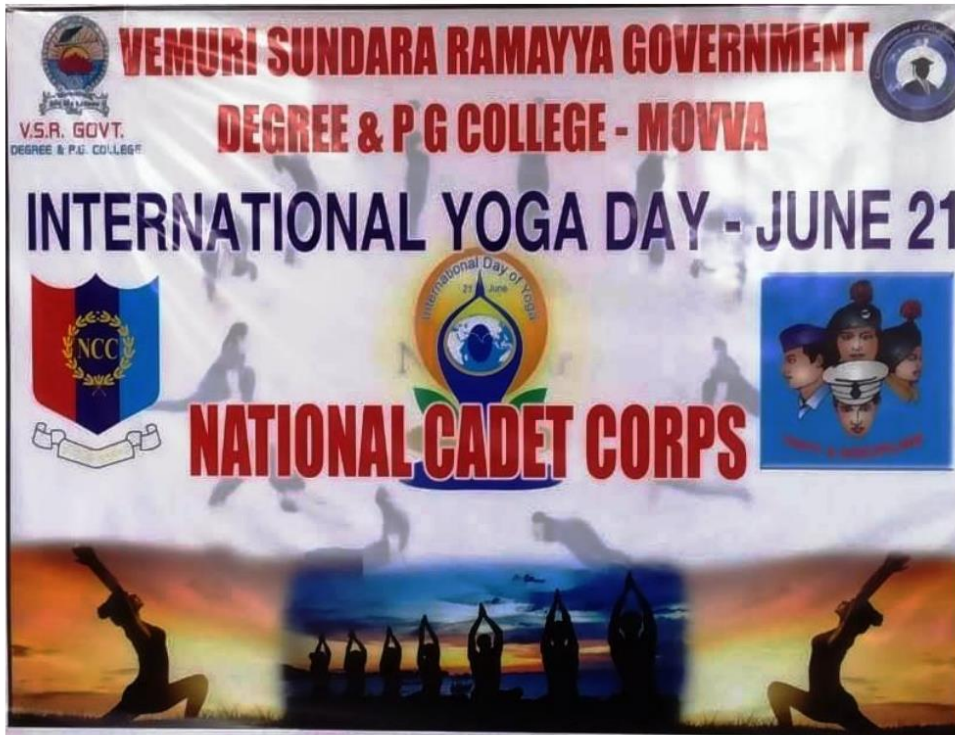



Some of the rights discussed include: Right to:


- equality
